

- V. Approval of Summary Notes for the September 3, 2008 Human Services Commission Regular Meeting:** Commissioner Samayoa requested that the Summary Notes be revised to reflect that Assistant City Attorney Maureen Conneely commented on the No Smoking Ordinance (Agenda Item VII). With this clarification, Commissioner Lind made a motion to approve the September 3, 2008 Meeting Summary Notes. Her motion was seconded by Commissioner Henderson, and approved unanimously.

VI. Social Services Funded Agency Tour De-Brief (Discussion): The Fall Social Services Agency Tour was canceled due to the fact that only one Commissioner had confirmed he would attend the Tour. There was discussion of the purpose and significance of the Funded Agency Tours, and the Chairperson encouraged Commissioners to attend the next Tour, which will be scheduled in Spring 2009.

VII. Approval of FY 08-09 HSC Meeting Schedule: It was noted that the FY 08-09 HSC Meeting Schedule was approved at a previous meeting.

VIII. Funding Process Orientation Update: The FY 09-10 Social Services Application will be available to review and discuss at the November HSC meeting.

- **Spectrum Community Services:** Commissioner Alarcon presented her report on Spectrum Community Services, which received an allocation of \$20,000.00 for its Senior Nutrition Program. Copies of her report were distributed to everyone in attendance.

B. Paratransit Report: The September Paratransit Report was distributed.

C. Day Labor Harassment Incident: Council Member Zermeño attended a Caesar Chavez High School meeting, at which students and their families reported that there are several men who stand on the sidewalks on West Tennyson, verbally accosting passersby, including elementary school students. There was discussion about how these problem behaviors by a relatively few individuals are causing the community to doubt the effectiveness of the nearby Day Laborer Center. There are several hundred day laborers who use the Day Laborer Center regularly, and most seem to be appreciative of the Center's assistance, which includes ESL classes and basic health screening, in addition to job placement assistance and advocacy.
