Energy Council JPA - Background

WMA

- Alameda County Waste Management Authority
 - Source reduction
 - Recycling


- Advance sustainability goals of member agencies
- Link between solid waste management and energy usage

JPA

- Invited member agencies to join an Energy Council JPA
- Secure funding to implement energy related programs



Energy Council JPA – Benefits



Energy Council JPA – Powers


- Adopt countywide ordinances applicable within a member agency only if the agency “opts-in”
- Will not have the power to impose taxes or fees
- Membership will not require contributions or payments from member agencies, other than staff resources
- Voting structure: each member has one vote, *except* Oakland has three votes, Alameda County, Fremont and Hayward each have two votes



Energy Council JPA – Next Steps

- JPA effective on April 12, 2013
- Cities of Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, Piedmont, and San Leandro, have already joined.
- If agencies choose not to join at this time, the option will still be available at a later date upon an affirmative vote by the JPA.
