The tyrannical fantasies of a madman? Or merely the opinions of the person now in control of science policy in the United States? *Or both?*


These ideas (among many other equally horrifying recommendations) were put forth by John Holdren,

- Single mothers and teen mothers should have their babies seized from them against their will and given away to other couples to raise;
- People who "contribute to social deterioration" (i.e. undesirables) "can be required by law to exercise reproductive responsibility" -- in other words, be compelled to have abortions or be sterilized.
- A transnational "Planetary Regime" should assume control of the global economy and also dictate the most intimate details of Americans' lives -- using an armed international police force.

Impossible, you say? That must be an exaggeration or a hoax. No one in their right mind would say such things.

Well, I hate to break the news to you, but it is no hoax, no exaggeration. John Holdren really did say those things, and this report contains the proof. The State Water Project plans to deliver 20 percent of the requested amounts—a figure that marks a 5 percent increase from its previous estimate in January.

However, it's the second-lowest amount since 1991, according to the California Department of Water Resources, which provides water to districts in the San Francisco Bay Area, San Joaquin Valley, and Southern California.

"It's a big deal, each little amount of water that we get," said Curtis Creel, assistant gen-

water stored underground. Some farmers will have to rely on groundwater or leave fields unplanted.

State officials said large storms in December and February along with careful management have put state reservoirs at higher levels than a year ago.

"We're confident that this water, delivered to local districts around the state, will help offset some economic harm of this extended drought," Mark Cowin, director of the state's Department of Water Resources, said in a statement.

Jeffrey Kightlinger, general

is offering up to \$50 million manager of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, said the slight increase was welcomed, but it does substantially change the picture. The district provides water to 19 million Southern California residents.

"Although Metropolitan continues to maintain water in reserve, we must carefully manage these supplies through the drought stretch beyond this year," Kightlinger said in a statement, adding that the district also receives water from the Colorado River.

Sonoma Officials Oppose Fluoride in Drinking Water

SONOMA—Sonoma's city council is opposing a proposal to add fluoride to the city's drinking water, after hearing concerns from residents.

The Santa Rosa Press Democrat newspaper reports council members voted 3-2 Monday against the plan to add the cavity-fighting mineral to its water supply. The council will send a letter of opposition to the county's board of supervisors.

Council member Laurie Gallian says she voted against sending the letter because the county was still in the process

of researching the fluoridation issue.

County health officials are pushing to add fluoride to the water, saying it is one of the most effective ways to prevent tooth decay and reduce dental care costs.

Fluoride opponents call the mineral dangerous and the science surrounding water fluoridation faulty.

Officials estimate it will cost \$587,000 a year to inject fluoride into the water supply.

programs were put into place to create a dependent, nonworking element in our society. The government then began to remove these programs from the people into a criminal class that did not exist in the '50s and '60s.
