FACILITIES PAINTER II**

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, the Facilities Painter prepares the worksite, materials and surfaces to be painted by scraping, sanding, taping and texturizing. He/she applies protective or decorative finishes such as paint, varnish, shellac, enamel or lacquer and performs a variety of painting tasks. These tasks include wallpaper hanging and touch-up work. This person may also assist in carpentry, electrical, mechanical and plumbing duties.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

FACILITIES PAINTER I

Positions assigned to this class are expected to perform complex, journey-level painting and painting preparation work, under minimum supervision. They are expected to efficiently schedule their own time, and to use initiative in acquiring skills in less experienced employees and work under adverse conditions.

FACILITIES PAINTER II

Positions assigned to this class handle master craftworker projects. These positions are flexibly staffed and are normally filled by advancement from the I level. When filled from the outside, they require prior journey-level experience.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

General supervision is provided by the Facilities maintenance Supervisor.

Assignments frequently require the supervision of less experienced Facilities maintenance personnel.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Depending upon assignment, duties may include but are not limited to the following:

1. Prepares the worksite, the materials, and the surfaces to be painted or repainted. Scrapes, sands, fills, and plasters surfaces such as wood, metal, glass, stucco, wallboard, brick and cement. Tapes, tints and texturizes walls and other surfaces in preparation for brush or spray gun paintings. Rigs and moves scaffolding and platforms, as needed to work from.
2. Applies protective or decorative finishes such as paint, varnish, shellac, enamel or lacquer to various surfaces of City buildings (interior/exterior), stationary equipment, furniture and cabinets. Includes painting simple signs. Also includes matching and mixing paint colors, as desired, by City departments and tenants.
3. Performs a variety of related painting trades tasks, including graffiti removal, wallpaper hanging and touch-up work.
4. Assists the Facilities Mechanic on pump repairs, disintegrator repairs, wet well repairs, fluoride equipment and Brodie valve installations, Sloan valve repairs, motor repairs, and arc and gas welding.
5. Performs minor electrical, plumbing and carpentry duties. Changes ballasts/light fixtures, replaces lamps in City buildings and on street lighting. Assists in remodeling work areas, making cabinets, installing floor tiles and baseboards, and unplugging drains, sinks and toilets. Performs daily routine maintenance on City buildings. Runs fluoride tests on water samples, picks up supplies and operates a forklift.

QUALIFICATIONS

FACILITIES PAINTER I

Knowledge, Abilities and Skills

- A. Knowledge of the Materials and Methodology used in the painting trade. Includes a knowledge of the processes of preparatory work; priming and painting; refinishing of hardwoods; mixing colors; glazing; graining and marbeling; and paperhanging.
- B. Journey-Level Ability to perform skilled tasks in the preparation of surfaces for painting, and in the mixing application and removal of paints and other finishes.

Knowledge, Abilities and Skills (continued)

- C. Ability to work from Blueprints, sketches, plans, specifications, instruction manuals, and oral directions.

- D. Knowledge of Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) safety requirements and equipment related to painting methodology, and working in confined spaces or at severe heights or depths.

Experience and Training

FACILITIES PAINTER I

Any combination equivalent to experience and education that could likely provide the required knowledge and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be:

Experience:

Four years of varied journey level painter experience involving the preparation and painting of wood, metal and masonry surfaces.

Training:

Equivalent to completion of a regular painter apprenticeship program.

License:

Possession of a valid Class III California Driver's License.

FACILITIES PAINTER II

In addition to the requirements for Facilities Painter I:

Experience:

Two years of experience performing duties comparable to those of a Facilities Painter I for the City of Hayward.
